

E-R2 - Recognition: selection for Arbitrum Founder House London 2026

Criterion: Mandatory recognition - digital technology Applicant: Temisan Gerrard Agbajoh

Summary

In June 2026 I was selected for Arbitrum Founder House London, a founder programme run by the Arbitrum Foundation with Offchain Labs and Encode Club. Arbitrum's own published record shows more than 490 registrations, with 140 builders selected across 64 projects. I attended the programme in London on 10-12 July 2026 and presented SettleSend, my stablecoin-based cross-border payments product, to founders, mentors and ecosystem participants.

What I did

- Applied and was selected for the programme (selection email, 29 June 2026).
- Attended the three-day in-person programme at Encode Hub, London, 10-12 July 2026.
- Presented and discussed SettleSend's recipient-controlled cross-border payments model with Arbitrum Foundation, Offchain and ecosystem mentors and other selected founders.
